Invitation Letter

Main Theme: "New Challenges for Innovation"

Many economic pundits believe that East Asia will be able to sustain strong growth trajectory in the 21st Century, eventually surpassing the GDPs of the United States and the European Union. To catapult East Asia's economy to a higher level, it must resolve many challenges and obstacles in moving from the current export-driven economy to a more innovative, knowledge-based economy. This calls for greater collaboration among all the key players including educational institutions, private enterprises, and governmental agencies in understanding and formulating strategies and policies for the future growth.

Historically, Asia has been the targets of the European colonialism since 15th century, and has consequently fought for resistance against the Western colonial powers. But, now Asia sees the opportunity of becoming not only the production and supply source of the goods and services to the world, but the ultimate destination and marketplace of the new affluence. But most importantly, Asia needs to become the new engine of the world economy as the center of the innovation as well as the research and development (R&D) in the new value creation. From these perspectives, the East Asian Innovation and Entrepreneurship Conference can serve as the most important vehicle among the top R&D universities in East Asia in that the East Asian educators in science and engineering can be better prepared in meeting future challenges and bringing about tangible accomplishments in the upcoming Asian era. After the successful inaugural conference at Tokyo University last year, KAIST is holding the second annual conference in November of this year in Seoul, Korea.


